Campus Map



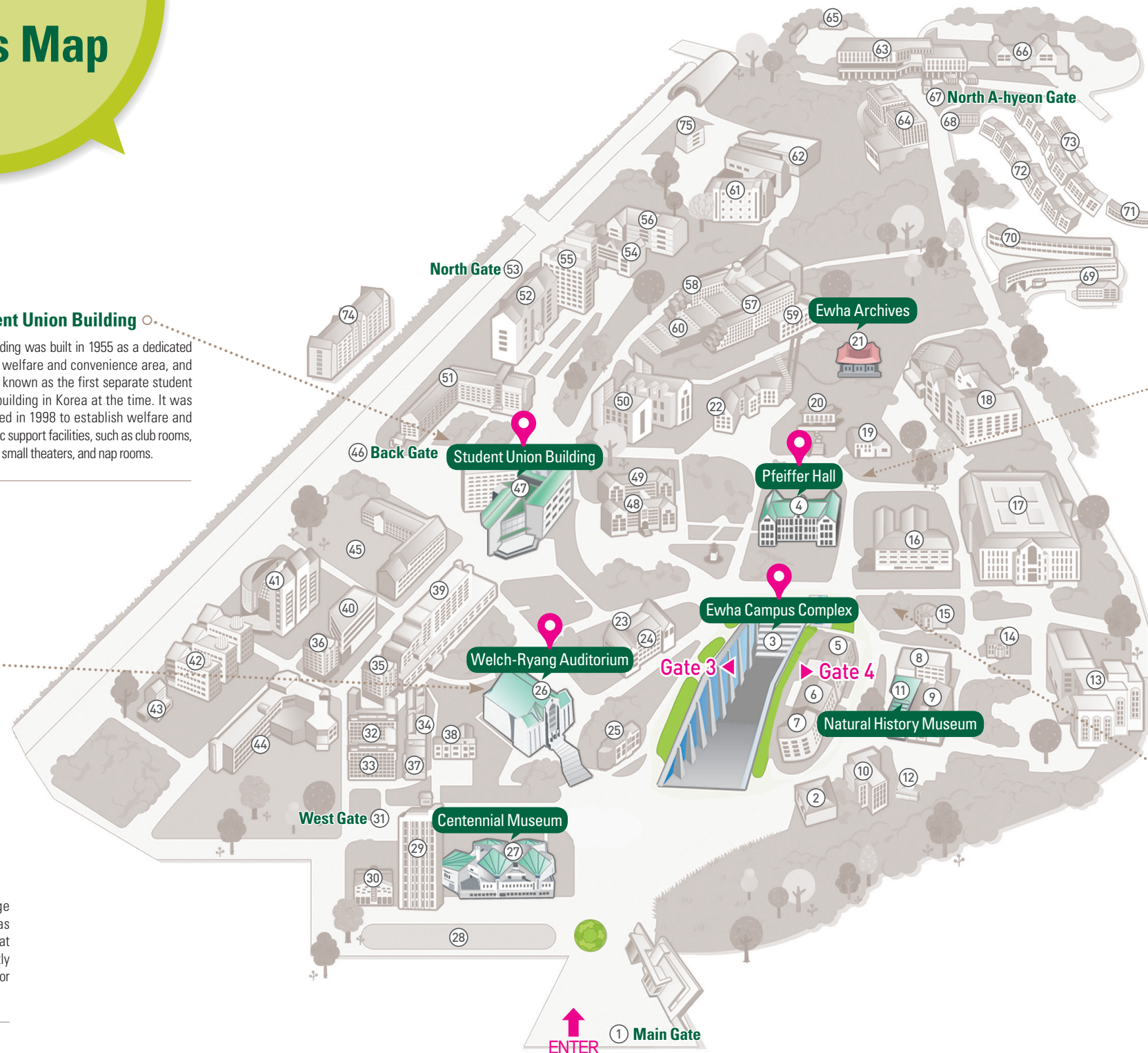
Student Union Building

This building was built in 1955 as a dedicated student welfare and convenience area, and became known as the first separate student center building in Korea at the time. It was renovated in 1998 to establish welfare and academic support facilities, such as club rooms, lounges, small theaters, and nap rooms.



Welch-Ryang Auditorium

Boasting 2,800 seats and cutting-edge facilities, this large-scale auditorium was recorded as the biggest auditorium in Asia at the time of its construction and is currently used for chapel services and other events for the Ewha community.

Pfeiffer Hall

Pfeiffer Hall was completed in 1935 as the main campus building where all students took their classes until the outbreak of the Korean War. Today, it is the main administration building on the campus and houses the Office of the President. It is a historic building that has been registered as a cultural heritage.

ECC (Ewha Campus Complex)

The ECC, which resembles an artificial valley, is the largest underground campus structure in Korea and houses a range of educational, cultural, and student facilities, featuring the collaboration of eco-friendly technology and design.
